3 - - - - -

4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning. Sorry
5 for the technical delay. Today is Wednesday,
6 March 17. Happy Saint Patrick's Day.

7 I'd like to call to order the meeting of
8 the Philadelphia City Commissioners.

9 We are going to begin today's meeting with
10 new business. And we will call Garrett Dietz
11 up for new business. Thank you.

12 MR. DIETZ: Thank you, Commissioners.
13 Good morning, everyone.

14 So I'm just going to go over some quick
15 procedures regarding ballot drawings before we
16 begin.

17 Each candidate who filed nomination
18 petitions for a local office will have the
19 opportunity to draw a slot to determine their
20 ballot position on the 2021 primary ballot.

21 For those candidates who wish to use a
22 proxy to draw for their ballot position, the
23 candidate must authorize the selected
24 individual by filing a proxy form with the

1 County Board of Elections.

2 Candidates who draw number one will be
3 placed first on the ballot. Those that draw
4 number two will be placed second and so on.

5 We will proceed through the candidate list
6 beginning with city-wide offices and then we
7 will proceed with judge and inspector of
8 election races beginning with the majority
9 party, which holds the Governor's office, the
10 Democratic party.

11 We will prioritize races where the
12 candidate or attending proxy is ready to draw.
13 We will draw judge and inspector of election
14 races in ward and division order.

15 In races where a candidate or proxy is
16 present, the candidate who has the earliest
17 timestamp on their nomination petition will
18 draw first, regardless of whether the candidate
19 or candidate's proxy with the earlier timestamp
20 is present.

21 For offices drawing on display, if the
22 candidate or candidate's proxy is not present,
23 the County Board of Election's employee will
24 draw on their behalf.

1 For judge and inspector of election races
2 where there is no candidate or candidate's
3 proxy ready to draw, we will use a random
4 function in Excel to assign ballot positions.
5 The Excel function will only be used for races
6 where no individual has already drawn.

7 The Excel spreadsheet will randomly assign
8 a number between 0 and 1 for each candidate.
9 The candidate with the largest number will be
10 assigned the first position on the ballot. The
11 candidate with the second largest number will
12 be assigned to the second position and so on.

13 Once ballot positions have been drawn,
14 either in person or through Excel, we will not
15 redraw for any reason.

16 And with that, I think we can start.

17 So to follow COVID guidelines and to
18 maintain a 6-foot distance, we have a modified
19 version of the coffee can of destiny here.

20 And we'll have Carlos Vega come up first
21 to draw for the Democratic nomination for
22 district attorney.

23 And we're going to have candidates that
24 draw from the can to -- if you don't mind,

1 putting on a sandwich glove first.

2 Okay. Mr. Vega has drawn position number
3 one.

4 Next candidate is Larry Krasner.

5 Mr. Krasner has drawn position number two.

6 That concludes drawings for city-wide
7 races. We're now going to move on to judge and
8 inspector of election races.

9 The ward and division order for candidates
10 or candidate's proxy that are in attendance --
11 I will bring the first group in.

12 Stanley Clark will draw first for judge of
13 election in Ward 12, Division 18. Okay. So
14 you're going to just draw a single ball out of
15 the can and that will determine your ballot
16 position.

17 MR. CLARK: (Complies.)

18 MR. DIETZ: You drew position number
19 three.

20 And then Shondra Jackson draws position
21 number two, which leaves position number one by
22 default to Mary Lydia Rollison.

23 And now you'll also be drawing for
24 inspector position for 12, 18, as well. This

1 time, Shondra, you're going to draw first.

2 Shondra drew position number two.

3 And Stanley Clark draws position number
4 one for inspector of election for Ward 12,
5 Division 18. And all of these are for the
6 democratic nomination except for the very last
7 race.

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you.

9 MR. DIETZ: I'll bring the next group in.

10 So Philip, you're going to draw first.
11 You're going to draw from the can.

12 MR. MURRAY: (Complies.)

13 MR. DIETZ: So Philip draws position
14 number two. And Edna draws position number one
15 for judge of elections for Ward 14, Division
16 10.

17 Ward 16, Division 15, inspector of
18 elections. All right. So Sheila drew position
19 number one, which means Katrina Pringle has
20 position number two.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you.

22 MR. DIETZ: All right. You drew position
23 number one.

24 MR. LYNCH: Name?

1 MR. DIETZ: Carmelita Sheppard. And that
2 means that Arlette Banks has position number
3 two for judge of election in Ward 36, Division
4 36.

5 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. Have a
6 great day.

7 MR. DIETZ: Next office we'll be drawing
8 for is judge of election in Ward 39, Division
9 30.

10 All right. Steven drew position number
11 two, which means Jessica Gath gets position
12 number one for judge of election Ward 39,
13 Division 30.

14 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you.

15 MR. DIETZ: Veronica Goode will draw
16 first. And you're position number two.

17 If you'd like to draw, it's up to you.
18 There's only one number left. And you drew
19 position number one.

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. Have a
21 lovely day.

22 MR. DIETZ: Veronica Good will be position
23 number two. Martina Madison will be position
24 number one on the ballot for inspector of

1 election, Ward 50, Division 4.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning.

3 MR. DIETZ: It looks like there's a Judy
4 Gaskins that will draw first, so -- Judy is not
5 here, so I'll draw on her behalf.

6 I drew number -- position number two for
7 Judy. If you'd like to draw the remaining
8 position. Cheryl drew position number one.

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. Have a
10 lovely day.

11 MR. DIETZ: That was for the inspector of
12 election for Ward 50, Division 5.

13 The next is inspector of elections for
14 Ward 50, Division 6.

15 Altrecia will draw first. You're going to
16 draw a ball out of the can to determine your
17 ballot position. And you're position number
18 one, which means Jannis Harris(ph) gets
19 position number two for inspector of election
20 Ward 50, Division 6.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you.

22 MR. DIETZ: Next we're going to draw for
23 inspector of election for Ward 50, Division 19.

24 There's a Gloria Clark who is not present

1 who should draw first, so I'll draw on Gloria's
2 behalf and then Addie Ford will draw second.

3 Gloria Clark drew position number two.
4 Addie Ford drew position number one for
5 inspector of election for Ward 50, Division 19.

6 And that is the end of candidates or
7 candidate proxies who are present.

8 So for the rest of our board worker
9 positions that have two or more candidates,
10 we're now going to randomize ballot positions
11 using the Excel spreadsheet.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you.

13 MR. DIETZ: So we're going to randomize
14 numbers for all candidates, but only the ones
15 that haven't just manually drawn will count.

16 So that is the random number that was
17 created. And again, the higher the number, the
18 better the position on the ballot. So the
19 larger number will be position number one. The
20 second highest number will be position number
21 two and so on.

22 And that concludes our drawing.

23 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I just want to say
24 thank you to our Election Activities Unit,

1 County Board of Election.

2 I'd like to thank Garrett Dietz and Eric
3 Capenstein(ph) for their work this morning.

4 And I also would like the record to
5 reflect Commissioner Sabir's presence via
6 telephone and the presence of Commissioner
7 Sabir's Deputy Devin Inka(ph).

8 So we will now proceed with the meeting
9 and we will hear any public comment.

10 Is anybody here for public comment?

11 (No response.)

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Hearing none, we will
13 proceed to a report from Secretary Sabir for
14 any e-mailed public comment.

15 COMMISSIONER SABIR: So there was no
16 e-mailed comments sent in.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you,
18 Commissioner Sabir.

19 We will now proceed to old business with a
20 report from our executive director, Joe Lynch.

21 MR. LYNCH: Good morning, Commissioners.
22 Can you hear me?

23 The report from the County Board of
24 Elections, for candidates running under the

1 Green, Libertarian or Workers-Only parties,
2 minor political party nomination papers are
3 available on our website or in City Hall, Room
4 142.

5 For candidates running under the third
6 party, political nomination papers are
7 available on our website or in City Hall, Room
8 142.

9 Nomination papers can be circulated
10 between March 10 and August 2. Further
11 information is available on our website.
12 Access to City Hall can be made by appointment
13 or by e-mailing Phillyelection@Phila.gov or by
14 calling (215) 686-3469.

15 We are currently accepting absentee or
16 mail-in ballot applications online at
17 VotesPA.com or by paper applications.

18 As of yesterday, we have approved 52,221
19 vote by mail applications. Of those, 44,223
20 are paper applications and 7,998 are electronic
21 applications.

22 Since yesterday's mail, we have,
23 approximately, 1,200 paper mail-in applications
24 outstanding and 239 online mail-in applications

1 outstanding. They should be processed by the
2 end of business today.

3 Yesterday was the deadline to file
4 objections for nomination petitions. There
5 were no objections filed for the local
6 candidates. However, there were several
7 challenges for judicial candidates running in
8 Philadelphia County.

9 One judge in the Superior Court
10 candidates, six Court of Common Pleas
11 candidates and four municipal candidates had
12 their candidacy challenged. These challenges
13 will be heard in the Commonwealth Court.

14 Voter Registration Unit, for the election
15 cycle to date, we have processed 88,713
16 applications of which, 6,600 were paper.

17 All registrations are up-to-date.
18 Imaging, Data, and Correspondence are
19 processing online and paper mail-in
20 applications.

21 This past week, the Registration Unit has
22 assisted 17 people in inspection of nomination
23 petitions.

24 The Election Board, last week, 137 workers

1 were trained at the Carpenters Union Hall from
2 3, 11 to 3, 14.

3 So far, this week, 68 poll workers were
4 trained at Esperanza -- that was for 3, 15 and
5 3, 16. And 161 were trained at Masterman for
6 3, 15 and 3, 16. The Unit is still making
7 calls to potential workers.

8 Election Activities are preparing
9 materials for the primary and assisting in the
10 opening of all of the paper mail-in
11 applications that are coming in.

12 The Polling Place Unit is securing and
13 serving polling places for Election Day.

14 That's all I have, Commissioners.

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you, Joe.

16 MR. LYNCH: Thank you.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Does anyone have
18 anymore new business?

19 (No response.)

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Okay. Having no more
21 business, I call for a motion to adjourn.

22 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

23 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

24 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.
