5	call the May 27, 2022 meeting of the Return
6	Board for the 2022 primary and special
7	elections to order.
8	First I will preserve the order and
9	decorum of these meetings. Everyone in
10	attendance should be on notice that shouting
11	out or interrupting the proceedings will not
12	be tolerated. Those who violate this will be
13	asked to leave.
14	The Sunshine Act permits anyone
15	attending a public meeting to object to a
16	perceived violation at any time during the
17	meeting.
18	If you chose to do so, please
19	succinctly state your objection. Objecting is
20	not an opportunity for speechmaking.
21	We will now move to public comment.
22	Commenters shall state where they live or if
23	they are not a resident of Philadelphia, that
24	they are a Philadelphia taxpayer or, since

1	this is a Return Board, which candidate they
2	represent.
3	Public comment it is not an opportunity
4	for dialogue or Q&A. It is public comment a
5	chance for you to tell us what you think.
6	Each speaker shall have two minutes.
7	However I may extend this time at my
8	discretion. All public comments must be
9	relevant or germane to board business.
10	Finally it is my responsibility to
11	preserve the order and decorum of these
12	meetings as such profane, slanderous,
13	discriminatory or personal attacks will not be
14	tolerated.
15	Anyone here representing a candidate to
16	offer argument on one of the ballot categories
17	they should wait until the category they wish
18	to make argument on is called later in the
19	meeting.
20	Anyone wishing to offer public comment
21	at this time please step forward. Hearing
22	none, we will now proceed to e-mail public we
23	will move to Commissioner Seth Bluestein for a
24	report on e-mailed public comment.

21	though I was very concerned that the voters
22	reporting that they did not receive their
23	requested ballot and they were unaware that
24	they were requesting them to be delivered to

the PO Box.
What we have found in this matter is
that there is no evidence that these voters
did anything wrong and they would like their
votes to count.
If someone did not knock on their door
they wouldn't be in this situation. The rest
is up to the DA. I motion that we count the
original ballot mailed to the PO Box 54705.

6	where the ballot was not enclosed in a secrecy
7	envelope, 116.
8	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Kevin, were these
9	voters determined to be registered voters.
10	MR. RICHARDSON: Yes.
11	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: These voters signed
12	the affidavit, correct?
13	MR. RICHARDSON: Yes.
14	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: So the only thing
15	wrong with these ballots that they are missing
16	a secrecy envelope, right?
17	MR. RICHARDSON: Yes.
18	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Is there anyone
19	here that wishes to offer argument on this
20	issue? As you know this is my issue. We went
21	through this the other day with the mail
22	ballots. I believe that the secrecy envelope
23	should be eliminated but this is a different
24	issue. Unlike the mail ballots where the

1	voters are filling them out at their kitchen
2	table, these voters are doing this process in
3	a polling place. The judge of elections
4	should be instructing them to place their
5	ballot in a secrecy envelope. So this is a
6	poll worker error that we should not be
7	punishing the voter for.
8	Furthermore the difference here is the
9	provisional ballots are outlined in federal
10	law to help America Vote Act and this is a
11	federal election.
12	State law determines if someone is
13	eligible to vote if we determine these voters
14	to be registered and that they signed an
15	affidavit and that they have not already voted
16	in a another way then we most count them.
17	Pennsylvania law has extra hurdles of putting
18	the ballot in a secrecy envelope has no
19	bearing on whether or not someone is qualified
20	to vote.
21	I therefore think PA law is in conflict
22	with the help American Vote Act and I motion
23	that we count the naked provisional ballots.
24	COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Like with the

1	mail-in ballots, I believe that the law should
2	be changed so that we can count naked ballots.
3	However until they change the law or an order
4	from the court, I believe that unfortunately
5	we are not able to count these ballots so I
6	make a motion that we do not count the ballots
7	not enclosed is a secrecy envelope.
8	COMMISSIONER SABIR: Second.
9	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner
10	Bluestein, please call the roll.
11	CHAIRWOMAN BLUESTEIN: Commissioner
12	Deeley?
13	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Nay.
14	COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote aye.
15	Commissioner Sabir?
16	COMMISSIONER SABIR: Madam Chair, if I
17	may before I cast my vote. As much as I would
18	like to count these ballots unfortunately it's
19	a state law we cannot count them and this is
20	one of the statues in the state law that
21	doesn't make sense just like we can't
22	pre-canvas the ballots. So with that being
23	said my vote is aye.
24	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: The ballots not

1	enclosed in a secrecy envelope the
2	provisional ballots not enclosed in a secrecy
3	envelope will not count the vote was 2 to 1.
4	Kevin, please proceed.
5	MR. RICHARDSON: We have one last
6	category. We have a chain of custody issue
7	for 15 ballots. That just appeared this
8	morning.
9	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Is there anybody
10	here to make argument on this issue? I make a
11	motion that these ballots with the chain of
12	custody issue not be counted.
13	COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Second.
14	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner
15	Bluestein, please call the roll.
16	COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Commissioner
17	Deeley?
18	CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.
19	COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote aye.
